

353rd Special Operations Group Public Affairs 10/25/2017 — Money makes the world go-round and operations at the 353rd Special Operations Group (SOG) would not be possible without the financial management team paying the bills.

"From equipment and training to multilateral exercises and real-world contingencies, nothing happens without money," said U.S. Air Force Capt. Brandy Jayne, 353rd SOG comptroller. "The hard work my finance team does here truly enables our operators to go out and perform the mission."

Unlike most military finance offices that take care of financial matters for the entire base, the 353rd SOG has embedded financial managers that deal solely with special operations forces (SOF)

appropriated funding.

"We fall under a different command here at Kadena that requires a better understanding of SOF funding and what it can be used for," said U.S. Air Force Master Sgt. Michael Duchesne Jr., 353rd SOG financial analysis section chief. "The ethical and congressional left and right limits are different than the rest of the Air Force, so we have the responsibility of advising commanders on the propriety of funds. Not only are we educating our customers on those boundaries, but also proactively finding options to execute unit requirements."

The finance team attends specialized schools to train themselves on all the funding appropriations and authorities available to SOF.

"Most finance offices only see Air Force

Operations and Maintenance (O&M) dollars and don't realize there are all these different appropriations and authorities out there," said Duchesne. "Here at the SOG we have such a unique mission that we have to think past what we know and find funding avenues outside the traditional O&M spectrum."

September 30th marks the end of the fiscal year and busiest time for the financial team working diligently on closing out books, checking numbers in the accounting system and executing available dollars toward unit requirements.

"Our biggest success has been our end of year," said Duchesne. "We were able to execute every single dollar that Special Operations Command sent down to us due to the constant communication with resource advisors, commanders



MCIPAC PMO's K-9 holds K-9 demonstration for OPP

10/20/2017 — Marine Corps Installations Pacific Provost Marshall Office's K-9 Team held its first demonstration for the Okinawa Prefectural Police K-9 Unit Oct. 20 at the Kadena Passenger Terminal on Kadena Air Base.

MCIPAC PMO's K-9 Team held this demonstration to showcase the capabilities of their Military Working Dogs to the OPP K-9 Unit, to strengthen their future partnership and to open up training opportunities for both sides.

The mission of a MWD is to detect and locate controlled substances, explosives and illegal narcotics. Handlers continuously train in different environments with the MWDs to ensure they are both engaged and ready.

"The demonstration showed two sides of our dual-purpose dogs," said Sgt. Rosendo Madrigal, a military police officer and dog handler with Headquarters and Support Battalion, MCIPAC-Marine Corps Base Camp Butler, Japan. "Our dogs are trained in either narcotics or explosives, as well as aggression. The bilateral training was more of a demonstration for the [OPP]."

There were two portions to the demonstration: the aggression training and the narcotics training. OPP's K-9 unit is currently only trained in tracking. In 2017 and 2018, they are looking to introduce narcotics and aggression capabilities.

According to Takeshi Amuro, a PMO

investigative officer and translator for the demonstration, MCIPAC PMO's K-9 handlers gave OPP pointers about training their dogs, and describe how PMO's K-9 trains. This will help them understand how to train their own handler and dog teams.

Takaharu Shimada, the superintendent of OPP, expressed his appreciation for the Marines and his excitement for future training opportunities.

"Thank you very much for today, it was great training," said Shimada "This helped us ease our nervousness and we enjoyed coming out today. I'm very impressed by what you have demonstrated. We learned a lot, and hopefully we can continue to learn alongside you in the future. There is no bridge to gap, we are all brothers."









CNFJ tours Okinawa in the name of partnership with the community

"Naval Forces have a relatively small presence here in Okinawa, but we are a vital part of the United States commitment to our alliance, and our Sailors work every day to fulfill that promise to protect Japan," said Fenton.

Fenton visited Japanese Self Defense Forces, Japanese government, and local leaders.

"Today's lecture was an invaluable opportunity to gain understanding about Okinawan history and culture," said Fenton. "I am here to listen and learn. I believe we cannot move forward together unless we know where we've been, and it's my responsibility to learn about the unique history and culture of this island. As guests in Japan, the Navy greatly values our partnerships with the local community. We want to build our partnership based on mutual respect and understanding."

Fenton also toured Navy installations on the island to assess the infrastructure and meet with Navy leadership.

He toured units including Personnel Support Detachment Okinawa, White Beach Naval Facility, and tenant commands such as Patrol Squadron 8 where he met with the crew.

"It's great to be able to talk to him so he can understand the importance of the mission here," said Command Master Chief Glenda Atwood assigned

If you look for a large arched green sign with some Japanese kanji letters on it on Kokusai street, that would be the entrance to this Heiwa dori sprawling off of Kokusai street.

Heiwa dori is a covered shopping arcade featuring many shops and vendors that sell local wares from stone Shisaa dogs which can be seen on almost all Okinawan homes and Mu-mu dresses to freshly

fried Okinawan doughnuts and unique snacks that often provided at the tables of celebrations.

There is also Makishi public market located on one of the alleyways, which offers unique Okinawa food including pigs face skin, pigs ears, seaweed, sea grapes and such.

Heiwa dori is worth your time to glimpse Okinawan culture and even try their daily meals.
