

CSAF highlights strength of partnerships at Singapore **International Airshow 18**

2/7/2018 - CHANGI INTERNATION-**AL AIRPORT, Singapore** — Gen. David Goldfein, U.S. Air Force chief of staff, spoke of the strength of regional partnerships at the opening day of the Singapore International Airshow at the Changi Exhibition Centre Feb. 6.

Scheduled to last through Feb. 11, the airshow is the largest defense exhibition and biennial international trade and airshow in the Pacific with approximately 50 nations and foreign delegations and 1.000 defense contractors participating.

In addition to Goldfein, Gen. Terrence O'Shaughnessy, Pacific Air Forces commander, and Heidi Grant, Deputy Under Secretary of the Air Force, International Affairs, comprised the U.S. Air Force

Goldfein met with various counterparts, Airmen and industry leaders during his 3-day visit to the airshow. The event allows senior Department of

Defense leaders to meet with regional counterparts to strengthen security ties. In addition to the interactions of with regional partners and allies, it gives Airmen, Sailors and Marines an opportunity to interact with the public.

"Our service members here at the Singapore Airshow have a distinct opportunity to interact," said Goldfein. "They're not only showcasing who we are as a military, but they have a chance to help mold the future of our militaries just by interacting with our younger generations. Even though they may interact with a child for a short amount of time, that child may grow up to replace us, whether it's in the U.S. military or in the Singapore military."

Appearing for the first time at the airshow, the U.S. Marine Corps F-35B Lighting II is expected to be a popular display, along with the F-22 Raptor. In addition to the 5th generation fighters, the C-17 Globemaster III, E-3B Sentry, KC-135 Stratotanker, RQ-4 Global Hawk, B-52H

Stratofortress, P-8 Poseidon, AH-6 Little Bird, F-16 Fighting Falcon, and F-18 Super Hornet will be providing static displays or aerial demonstrations during the event.

Through participation in airshows and regional events, the U.S. demonstrates its commitment to the security of the Indo-Pacific region, promotes interoperability, displays the flexible combat capabilities of the U.S. military,

and creates lasting relationships with international audiences to strengthen the bonds that support partnership building throughout the Indo-Pacific region.

"We are looking for every opportunity in our partnerships where we can find common interests, and have our militaries continue to support one another as we strengthen our partnerships through airshows like this," said Goldfein.

AF streamlines voting program to help optimize Airmen's core missions

2/6/2018 - JOINT BASE SAN ANTONIO-RANDOLPH, Texas — Air Force officials recently released guidance that streamlines the organizational structure and functions of the Air Force Voting Assistance Program.

A November 2017 Air Force guidance memorandum realigned the program under installation Airman and Family Readiness Centers, thereby eliminating voting assistance officers as an additional duty at Air Force units. The move is part of an Air Force-wide effort to reduce Airmen's additional duties so they can more effectively focus on their core missions.

The Air Force Voting Assistance Program ensures Airmen, their eligible family members and overseas U.S. citizens are aware of their right to vote and have the necessary tools and resources to do so worldwide. Program representatives assist with voter registration and absentee ballots, coordinate voting awareness campaigns and answer various voting questions.

"Having the Voting Assistance Program knowledge base located at the Airman and Family Readiness Centers makes it more convenient for Airmen to get the information they need since they already attend mandatory arrival and departure briefings there," said Kelly Weakly, Air Force Voting Assistance Operations Program Manager at the Air Force's Personnel Center.

Airmen are also required to attend pre- and post-deployment briefings at their installation Airman and Family Readiness Centers if they are deploying for six months or more. Before deploying, voting assistance officers remind Airmen to update their temporary address (deployed location) and obtain an absentee ballot in case there is an election while deployed.

Deploying Airmen also receive a Federal Post Card Application that can be used to register to vote, request an absentee ballot and submit a change of address to local election officials. During their reintegration brief, voting assistance representatives remind Airmen to change their address back to their home address to ensure they receive their absentee ballots at the correct location.

In addition to deployments, active-duty Airmen are also required to check into the centers when separating from the service or retiring.

"During each of these touchpoints, we provide Airmen voting forms and an information sheet to make the voting process as easy and convenient as possible," Weakly said. "Our goal is to ensure our active-duty members and their families are fully informed and can exercise their right to vote."

Bonhomme Richard arrives in Okinawa, Embarks 3d Marine Division Marines


USS Bonhomme Richard (LHD 6) Public Affairs **2/6/2018** - **WHITE BEACH** — The Amphibious assault ship USS Bonhomme Richard (LHD 6) arrived at White Beach, Okinawa to embark Marines assigned to 3d Marine Division (3d MARDIV), Jan. 31, in preparation for Exercise Cobra Gold 2018.

While in port, Bonhomme Richard will embark 3d MARDIV personnel, vehicles and equipment before continuing a scheduled patrol in which the team will participate in the multilateral exercise.

Bonhomme Richard, along with embarked MH-60S Sea Hawks, assigned to the "Sea Knights" of Helicopter Sea Combat Squadron (HSC) 22, departed from Sasebo, Japan, Jan. 23.

"I am looking forward to embarking our 3d MARDIV counterparts and kicking off Cobra Gold," said U.S. Navy Capt. Larry McCullen, commanding officer of Bonhomme Richard. "With our embarked surface units and aviation squadrons, Bonhomme Richard's crew and the Blue-Green team provide a wide range of capabilities for any type of mission. This is what we train for, and working together with our allies will give us the opportunity to demonstrate our numerous capabilities as a warfighting ship and amphibious force."

During the transit from Sasebo, Bonhomme Richard embarked aviation units that will form the Aviation Combat Element of a Marine Air Ground Task Force. Embarked assets include AH-1Z Vipers, assigned to the "Gunfighters" of Marine Light Attack

Helicopter Squadron (HMLA) 369, and CH-53E Super Stallions, assigned to the "Wolfpack" of Heavy Marine Helicopter Squadron (HMH) 466. Additionally, landing craft air cushions (LCACs) of Naval Beach Unit 7 are embarked to provide a seaborne ship-to-shore capability.

Prior to arriving at White Beach, Bonhomme Richard conducted multiple shipboard certifications, gun exercises and combat systems test fires, to include a pre-aim calibration fire (PACFIRE) and a towed drone unit (TDU) exercise with the MK 15 close-in weapons system (CIWS).

"We have the ability to engage air targets as well as surface contacts," said Fire Controlman 2nd Class Alexandria Ricalde, from Roy, Wash. "During the PACFIRE, we shot the "killer tomato" [a balloon-like gunnery target], and that was to test our surface shoot, whereas the

TDU [a missile-shaped target towed by an aircraft] fire was to test our air capabilities."

Testing CIWS ensures that the system will track and fire with precision when called into action as a defense against inbound air and surface threats, said Ricalde.

Bonhomme Richard and the embarked Marines are scheduled to train alongside Royal Thai Armed Forces counterparts in the annual exercise Cobra Gold and serve as a ready-force for any type of contingency while on the multi-month patrol.

Cobra Gold is the largest theater security cooperation exercise in the Indo-Asia-Pacific region and is an integral part of the U.S. commitment to strengthen engagement in the region. The exercise is designed to advance regional security and ensure effective response to regional crises by exercising a robust multinational force from nations sharing common goals.

How to File a Complaint with IG

If you believe you are unable to resolve your complaint through supervisory channels, you may seek IG assistance to determine if the complaint should be filed with the IG. You can file a complaint if you reasonably believe inappropriate conduct has occurred or a violation of law, policy, procedures, or regulation has been committed. Complete the personnel data information on an AF Form 102 and briefly outline the facts and relevant information related to the issue or complaint. List the allegations of wrongdoing briefly, in general terms and provide supporting narrative detail and documents later, when interviewed by an IG person. Allegations should be written as bullets and should answer who committed the violation; what violation was committed; what law, regulation, procedures, or policy was violated; when did the violation occur. 


