Locals visit Kadena sacred sites, show family heritage

3/22/2018 — Approximately 40 local nationals from Okinawa visited Kadena Air Base, March 21, to pay respects at preserved sacred sites during an annual tour.

The tour allows the elders to show the younger generations where and how their ancestors lived. The sites have been preserved throughout Kadena as a sign of respect to the locals that once inhabited the area.

"This visit provides a significant learning experience to the younger generation

of Shimosedo Residents Association," said Seitoku Sakugawa, president of the Shimosedo Residents Association. "Even though we no longer see any trace of how Shimosedo ward used to be, we – as senior residents who remember the area - would like to hand down our social and cultural lineage within the ward."

The younger generation was able to learn of their family's lifestyle before and after World War II. The tour provided background on practices and traditional events, hometown culture and family roots, explained Sakugawa.

The event sees between 15 and 17

families per year, and encompasses two to three generations.

The importance of transferring information to the younger generations was not lost on tour members. With some families moving to the region over 300 years ago and hundreds of years of history in others, Sakugawa felt the impact of the tour.


"This visit is becoming an annual event and it is very meaningful for us to share with our children and grandchildren how our ancestors lived," Sakugawa said. "We recall our childhood memories and reminisce on old times."

Remembering the lineage and heri-

tage of families can be very important as locations change over time, Sakugawa explained. As Kadena Air Base has changed, so have the areas that these families once inhabited.

The members of the Shimosedo Residents Association see value in tours like this, and appreciate Kadena for allowing them to teach the younger generations about their heritage before time erodes the past, expressed Sakugawa.

"We feel that it is very important to continue this visit in order for us to teach generation to generation about our hometown," Sakugawa said.

Kadena Airman selected Olmsted Foundation scholarship

3/26/2018 - JOINT BASE SAN ANTO-NIO-RANDOLPH, Texas — The Air Force has selected five officers for the award of a 2019 Olmsted Foundation scholarship, sponsored by the George and Carol Olmsted Foundation.

The Olmsted Foundation offers outstanding young military leaders the opportunity to become fluent in a foreign language, pursue graduate study at an overseas university and develop understanding of foreign cultures.

The Air Force's Personnel Center selection board and the Olmsted Foundation Board of Directors selected Capt. Jonathan Goldstein, Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst, New Jersey, to study in Hungary; Maj. Adam Gray, JBMDL, New Jersey, to study in Japan; Maj. Hunter Grunden, Kadena Air Base, to study in France; Capt. Matthew Pfarr, Davis-Monthan Air Force Base, Arizona, to study in the Czech Republic; and Maj. Christopher Travelstead, Dvess AFB, Texas, to study in China.

"As a key security cooperation program, the Air Force provides many training opportunities that enable us to amplify our collective strengths and improve our ability to confront shared challenges with our international partners," said Kris Hunter, Officer Development Education deputy chief at AFPC. "Participants will experience cultural immersion in a selected country, providing an in-depth understanding of foreign languages and cultures."

The selected officers could spend up to a year in language proficiency training at the Defense Language Institute, if needed, followed by two years of study in a foreign graduate program.

"The education and training of our Total Force must be relevant and responsive," Hunter said. "The Olmsted scholarship offers our officers a rare, invaluable opportunity to develop academically as well as culturally. This ultimately builds enduring partner capabilities and capacities to ensure regional and global security in the air, space and cyberspace domains."


Prior to releasing the list, AFPC provided senior raters with advanced knowledge of their officers' selection to allow notification through the chain of command.

835th redeploys Okinawa based Warfighter's equipment and materiel ISO Exercise Cobra Gold 2018



3/26/2018 - NAHA MILITARY PORT — The enormous responsibility of Projecting Combat Power by providing global surface transportation to the Joint Force is inherent to the United States Army Military Surface Deployment and Distribution Command (SDDC); the Army's Service Component Command to the United States Transportation Command (TRANSCOM). In the Okinawa area of responsibility, the 835th Transportation Battalion (835th) is SDDC's choice terminal battalion that delivers this capability to combatant commanders, the Joint Warfighter, defense agencies and

On March 19, the Commercial Vessel OCEAN JAZZ, moored at Naha Military Port, (NMP). At 0830, the 835th commenced vessel discharge of equipment and materiel to returning Okinawa units to complete the redeployment phase of Exercise Cobra Gold (Thailand), Pacific Pathways 2018. The core responsibilities of the 835th Terminal Management Team (TMT) was receiving the OCEAN JAZZ at the Seaport of Debarkation (SPOD), discharging the customer unit equipment, staging the equipment, maintaining control and in-transit visibility (ITV), and then releasing the equipment to units for onward movement and inte-

gration. Other functions of the TMT included, supervising and providing direction to contract Stevedores and Related Terminal Services (S&RTS). The S&RTS are Japanese host nation laborers that contribute tremendously to the mission, by assisting in the mooring of the vessel, preparing the equipment for discharge, operating cranes and material handling equipment (MHE), and when directed; operating military equipment to assist in reception and staging operations. The 835th also works closely with S&RTS

personnel in Thailand, Indonesia, Philippines, and Malaysia when conducting vessel operations in their location. The OCEAN JAZZ discharge was a total of one business day and port clearance of all equipment was a period of two business days. In total, the 835th TMT discharged 238 pieces of military vehicles and materiel consisting of tactical and sustainment wheeled vehicles, trailers, and container break bulk cargo.

This coming April, the 835th will again have an opportunity to sharpen its

competitive edge during vessel upload and discharge operations, to enable power projection in support of Exercise Balikatan (Philippines), Pacific Pathways 2018. The dependency of the 835th skillset is incumbent upon its ability to get surface deployment tasks right and to get better results through "repetition," so it can deploy a sizeable force on limited notice throughout the Pacific Command (PACOM) area of responsibility during training, contingencies, disaster/humanitarian relief, and other directed missions.



Carl Vinson completes bilateral exercise with Japan

3/26/2018 - PACIFIC OCEAN — The Carl Vinson Strike Group completed a bilateral exercise in the Western Pacific with the Japan Maritime Self-Defense Force (JMSDF), March 23.

Aircraft carrier USS Carl Vinson (CVN 70) and destroyer USS Wayne E. Meyer (DDG 108) conducted combined operations with Japanese helicopter destroyer JS Ise (DDH 182) in the South China Sea and waters near Okinawa, Japan. The operations began March 11 and included a series of training drills and Sailor-to-Sailor exchanges designed to enhance maritime interoperability between longstanding allies.

"I thought it was really cool to have this opportunity," said Information Systems Technician 2nd Class Jeremiah Karelius, a communications watch officer aboard Carl Vinson. Karelius hosted a communications operator from Ise during a four-hour exchange visit on the aircraft carrier.

"We talked about the similarities in our jobs and what made them different," he said. "Working together now makes it easier to understand how our systems are structured so that we can troubleshoot if we encounter problems while working together again."

Japanese and U.S. Sailors also conducted anti-submarine and air-defense exercises as well as training drills for multinational command and control functions. The three vessels also steamed in close formation and completed several replenishments-at-sea together.

"It was pretty fun," said Hospital Corpsman 3rd Class Aaron Roberts



who participated in an exchange with Japanese counterpart from Ise. "It was pretty much just an all-around learning experience for both parties. This was a great building block."

During the bilateral exercise, Carl Vinson also operated jointly with the

U.S. Marine Corps. Okinawa-based MV-22B Osprey aircraft from Marine Medium Tiltrotor Squadron (VMM) 262 completed carrier deck landing qualifications aboard Carl Vinson and helped transport personnel to and from shore.

Carl Vinson Strike Group is on a regularly scheduled deployment in the Western Pacific. It also includes Carrier Air Wing 2 and a complement of more than 70 aircraft, Destroyer Squadron 1 and guided-missile destroyer USS Michael Murphy (DDG 112).

How to File a Complaint with IG

If you believe you are unable to resolve your complaint through supervisory channels, you may seek IG assistance to determine if the complaint should be filed with the IG. You can file a complaint if you reasonably believe inappropriate conduct has occurred or a violation of law, policy, procedures, or regulation has been committed. Complete the personnel data information on an AF Form 102 and briefly outline the facts and relevant information related to the issue or complaint. List the allegations of wrongdoing briefly, in general terms and provide supporting narrative detail and documents later, when interviewed by an IG person. Allegations should be written as bullets and should answer

who committed the violation; what violation was committed; what law, regulation, procedures, or policy was violated; when did the violation occur. Help is available: Call your Kadena IG office at 634-7622 for Maj. Sarabia or 634-1109 for Mr. Lovingood, or leave a message on the Kadena Fraud Waste & Abuse (FWA) Hotline at 634-0404.
