Advance assignments now available to Airmen deploying for 365-day Extended Deployments

11/7/2018 - WASHINGTON — Effective Nov. 1, active duty Airmen selected for an extended deployment may apply to receive an advance assignment up to 16 months prior to the projected Report Not Later Than Date of the assignment.

This means Airmen can have permanent change of station orders in hand immediately after completing all required PCS actions and before departing on their deployment, providing their dependents the option to move early to their next assignment location.

"This change recognizes the need for us to increase stability and predictability for our Airmen and their families and helps our Airmen focus on their mission while deployed," said Lt. Gen. Brian Kelly, Air Force Deputy Chief of Staff for Manpower, Personnel and Services. "The ability to receive an assignment prior to departing for an extended deployment allows Airmen to make decisions that are good for them and their families."

Previously, Airmen or

extended deployments were required to be deployed for at least 60 days before being notified about potential assignments, and orders were not published earlier than 120 days prior to the new reporting date, making it difficult for Airmen and their families to plan.

In 2017, the Air Force's Personnel Center chartered a 365-Day Extended Deployments Working Group to look at initiatives to find better ways to accommodate and incentivize year-long deployments. Approximately 400 Airmen per year are selected for 365-day extended deployment.

The 365-day deployment policy change allows Airmen time to out-process from their losing base, provides the option to move their dependents to the new assignment location, and gives Airmen the option to request movement from their deployed location directly to their new assignment without having to return to their currently assigned unit first.

Airmen selected for an extended deployments should contact their local Military Personnel Section for more information.

U.S. and Japanese forces deliver air superiority to exercise Keen Sword

11/12/2018 - YOKOTA AIR BASE, Japan — U.S. and Japan Self-Defense Force service members across air, land and sea concluded one of the largest and most complex bilateral field training exercises, operating more than 200 bilateral and joint aircraft, which flew over 1,100 missions and integrated with more than 25 naval ships, Nov. 8.

Increasing Interoperability

The Keen Sword exercise scenario required U.S. and Japanese air forces to transport and deploy ground teams and cargo to bare bases, rapidly shift operations from one base to another and seamlessly integrate with maritime forces to overwhelm and defeat an aggressive, multi-pronged threat.

With such a complex scenario and countless moving pieces, the questions

lingers: how can two sovereign nations cohesively track thousands of missions launched from more than 10 bases across Japan?

While this seems a daunting task, U.S. and Japanese Airmen rose to the challenge and tracked the status of aircraft, munitions, parts, and airfields to support and maintain integrated air, land, and sea operations while rapidly analyzing and disseminating vital information to the 57,000 Keen Sword participants.

"For the first time, 5th Air Force and Japan's Air Defense Command centrally coordinated and planned live-fly operations as a bilateral team, effectively executing parallel air tasking orders and tracking and disseminating the status and movement of our forces," explained Brig. Gen Todd A. Dozier, 5th Air Force vice commander and Pacific Air Forces Joint Air Component Coordination Element director. "From the air operations coordination center, our

forces coordinated with the USS Ronald Reagan (CVN76), U.S. and Koku Jieitai (Japan Air Self-Defense Force) squadrons, 613th Air Operations Center (AOC) as well as air and tactical controllers to effectively produce overwhelming air superiority in a challenging scenario."



"During Keen Sword, U.S. and Japanese air forces engaged and successfully neutralized simulated dynamic targets on an extremely short timeline," said Maj. Brandon Murphy, 5th Air Force current and future operations chief and air operations coordination center lead. "Moving forward, 5th Air Force and the Koku Jieitai will continue to leverage lessons learned and hone the principals of dynamic targeting. The tactics, techniques and procedures developed in this and future exercises will ensure both air forces can effectively coordinate and deconflict air operations to outpace any threat, or rapidly respond to a disaster in the region."


The U.S.-Japan Alliance has been the cornerstone of regional peace and security in the Indo-Pacific region for nearly 60 years, and events like Keen Sword are essential to creating a common understanding of how to effectively execute air operations and enhance interoperability while bolstering each force's readiness, and if called upon, provide the defense of Japan against potential regional threats.

Keen Sword, the field training exercise dating to 1986, is held biennially, alternating yearly with Keen Edge, the command post exercise.

Keen Sword 19: Historic first JGSDF jump from USAF C-130Js in Japan

11/7/2018 - YOKOTA AIR BASE, Japan — The U.S. Air Force C-130J Super Hercules aircraft from the 36th Airlift Squadron became the first U.S. aircraft to drop Japan Ground Self-Defense Force soldiers on Hiju-dai drop zone, Oita prefecture, Japan, Nov. 4, during Keen Sword 2019.

The JGSDF soldiers with the 1st Airborne Brigade, observed by U.S. Army Alaska soldiers, jumped from the C-130J Super Hercules, showcasing one of Keen Sword 19's capability to bring military power together to train.

"It is great that we are finally able to drop JGSDF paratroopers from U.S. aircraft in Japan," said Capt. Jeffrey Larkin, 36 AS C-130J pilot and Keen Sword 19 C-130J mission commander. "Also this is the first time that we (36th AS) will fly over Hiju-dai drop zone. This is another exciting moment for us because we can fly in an atypical environment."

Since 2015, 36 AS and JGSDF 1st Airborne Brigade have been conducting joint jump training during Red-Flag Alaska. With this historic first combined jump training in Japan, U.S. and Japanese Airmen and Soldiers hope that it will allow for more opportunities for future training and collaboration to strengthen bonds between the two nations.

"Working with the Japanese Airborne community increases bonds and friend-ships, and it also increases the understanding of the strategic value of both airborne communities," said U.S. Army Master Sgt. Nathan Greer, U.S. Army Alaska jump master.

The jump highlighted the U.S.-Japan's strong commitment to a free and open Indo-Pacific region, but the aircraft was just one moving piece in a large-scale area seizure scenario during Keen Sword 19, the first of its kind during the exercise.

"We (36AS) delivered service members, between U.S. and Japan Self-Defense Forces, from Okinawa to Misawa," said Larkin. "Also we conducted mass Container Delivery System (CDS) drops at Hiju-dai DZ (dropzone)."

The scenario: The prior-arrived 120 JGSDF paratroopers at the Japan Air Self-Defense Force (JASDF) Tsuiki Air Base at Fukuoka prefecture conducted airdrop training from the U.S. C-130J aircraft at Hiju-dai exercise areas, Oita prefecture, located approximately 810km from Yokota Air Base.

"Everything was excellent." said Greer.

"As a Jump Master, they (JGSDF) jumped safely and accurately. This is most important thing for jumpers, and they were professionals during the airborne operation."

Keen Sword gives U.S. and Japanese Forces an opportunity to practice critical air, maritime and amphibious capabilities

essential for Japan's defense and for regional security. Also the exercise is the latest in a series of bilateral field training exercises that for more than 30 years have increased combat readiness and interoperability between the U.S. and JSDF.

"The scenario gave us the opportunity to practice tactical airlift to deliver supplies and personnel at a moment's notice." said U.S. Air Force Staff Sgt. Brian Gates, 36th Airlift Squadron C-130J loadmaster. "Any joint training provides greater awareness of how U.S. military and JSDF train to prepare for future contingencies and it help us stay ready to provide joint support when we are called upon."


















11/8/2018 - CAPITOL HILL, Saipan — More than 500 service members from Joint Region Marianas and other units from within Indo-Pacific Command assigned to Task Force-West (TF-W) are providing Department of Defense (DoD) support to the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands' (CNMI) civil and local officials as part of the FEMA-supported Super Typhoon Yutu recovery efforts, which began Oct. 25 immediately following the storm.

"We are working alongside the people of CNMI to help recover and ensure

people get the assistance they need," said Navy Rear Adm. Shoshana Chatfield, commander of TF-W. "I am extremely proud of the hard work and dedication I've seen from my team, both on Saipan and Tinian, and I know they will continue to put forth their best effort until contributions from the DoD are no longer needed."

Super Typhoon Yutu was the strongest typhoon to hit a U.S. territory and was the second-strongest system to hit U.S. soil in recorded history, according to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. The Category 5 super typhoon had sustained winds of 178

mph, which devastated much of Saipan and Tinian.

"Ensuring the health and safety of our family following the storm is our top priority," said Governor Ralph DLG. Torres. "This is the worst storm anyone in the CNMI has ever seen, and we must ensure we take care of each other. We are grateful for the partnership we have with FEMA and our military partners on island to help us during this difficult time. To our federal and military partners, Si Yu'us Ma'ase for your continued support; thank you from the bottom of our hearts."

More than 50,000 residents on

Saipan and Tinian are coming together with outside entities to recover from the destruction caused by Super Typhoon Yutu.

"The CNMI government, American Red Cross, FEMA and the DoD are prioritizing life-saving and life-sustaining missions throughout the designated islands of CNMI," said Bern Ruiz, FEMA Federal Coordinating Officer for FEMA, the U.S. government's domestic emergency response agency. "We are focused on restoring community lifelines and working to ensure food,

water, medical and critical supplies are available in sufficient quantity.'

During Defense Support to Civil Authorities (DSCA) operations, the U.S. military provides essential support to American citizens affected by declared natural disasters. With FEMA as the lead Federal agency, TF-W continues to partner with civil and local agencies to perform debris clearance on public lands and assist with distribution of water and food to people in need.

"To the people of CNMI: we stand here with you during this time of crisis," said Chatfield. "Your military is here to help. We are Marianas Strong."

TF-W is a joint task force. It is divided into Task Group Saipan and Task Group Tinian, and is comprised of active duty, reserve, and Guam National Guard service members from more than 20 different units across every branch of service. Service members traveled from Japan, Guam, Hawaii, and parts of the continental U.S. as part of TF-W's DSCA mission. TF-W is providing DoD support to the CNMI civil and local officials as part of the FEMA-supported Typhoon Yutu recovery efforts.

How to File a Complaint with IG

If you believe you are unable to resolve your complaint through supervisory channels, you may seek IG assistance to determine if the complaint should be filed with the IG. You can file a complaint if you reasonably believe inappropriate conduct has occurred or a violation of law, policy, procedures, or regulation has been committed. Complete the personnel data information on an AF Form 102 and briefly outline the facts and relevant information related to the issue or complaint. List the allegations of wrongdoing briefly, in general terms and provide supporting narrative detail and documents later, when interviewed by an IG person. Allegations should be written as bullets and should answer who committed the violation; what violation was committed; what law, regulation, procedures, or policy was violated; when did the violation occur. Help is available: Call your Kadena IG office at 634-7622 for Maj. Sarabia or 634-1109 for SMSgt. Southern, or leave a message on the Kadena Fraud Waste & Abuse (FWA) Hotline at 634-0404.


