

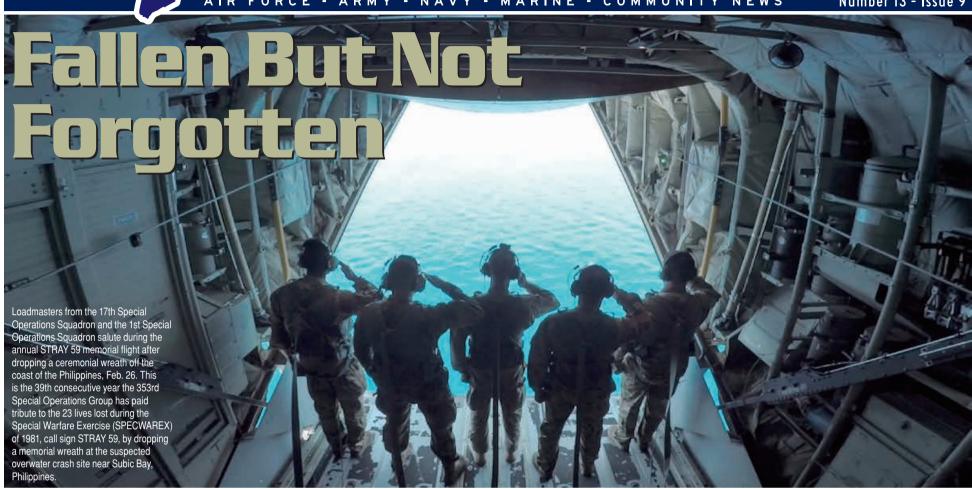

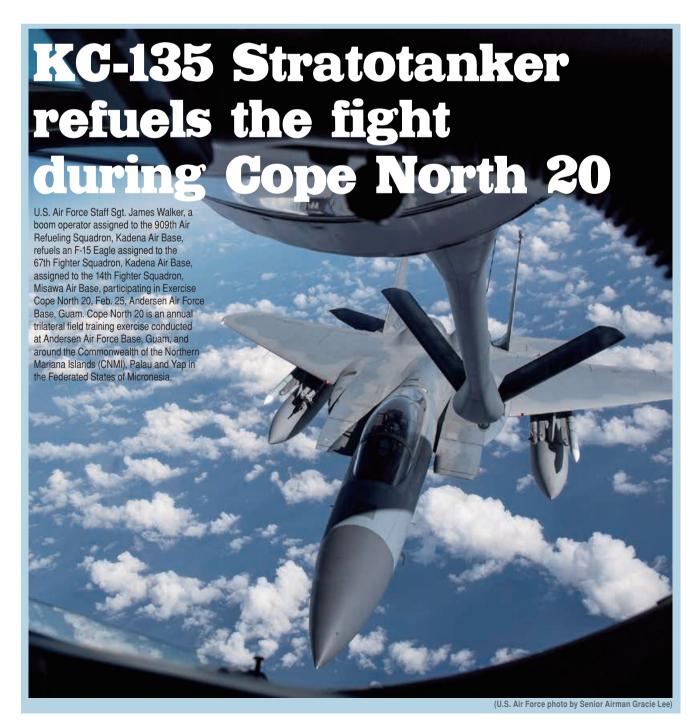

3/4/2020 — Due to the rising number of cases of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) in the region, the 18th Wing has decided to cancel AmericaFest 2020.

The open house event, scheduled for April 25th, was predicted to attract a crowd of over 50,000 people from around the region. Given concerns about the spread of COVID-19, the 18th Wing commander made the decision to cancel the event.

"The safety of our community, both on and off base, is my top priority, and with the number of cases of COVID-19 continuing to rise the safest thing to do is to cancel AmericaFest 2020," said Brig. Gen. Joel L. Carey. "Team Kadena was really looking forward to this event and are disappointed to see it cancelled, but we need to make sure everyone stays safe and healthy."

As a result of the cancellation, Kadena Air Base is planning to host AmericaFest 2021 next spring. Details of the event will be released as they become available.

Multinational medics, civilian first responders 'save lives' at exercise Cope North 20

Cope North Combined Joint Information Bureau 2/29/2020 - ANDERSEN AIR FORCE BASE, Guam — When lives are on the line, there is no margin for error – and for a group of multinational medics and first responders, their razor-thin life-saving operations were put to the test during a Cope North 20 joint, mass casualty (MASCAL) field training exercise on the islands of Rota and Guam, Feb. 20.

Together, the United States Air Force and Navy, Japan Air Self-Defense Force (JASDF), and Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF) raced against the clock in a realistic exercise scenario to save 24 patients from a bus rollover. They worked alongside Guam's Army National Guard and local police and emergency medical personnel during integrated medical, air and ground operations.

Amidst the sounds of injured patients screaming, helicopters chopping and police sirens blaring, the team persevered past extreme duress to accomplish their goal: keeping every patient alive.

"When providing care for critical patients, minutes can often make the difference between life and death," said USAF Maj. Brian Johnson, Cope North 20 medical planner. "Due to the (patient transport) distance and time of day, ground patient transfer wouldn't have resulted in a favorable outcome had it been a real-life scenario. However, thanks to the Guam Police Department and local authorities, the patients who weren't flown were able to get to

U.S. Naval Hospital Guam in an expedited and safe manner."

Mass casualty scenario - the bus crash

The synergistic movement kicked off with screeching tires as a bus driver lost control while driving on the island of Rota. Gliding into traffic, a loud, piercing boom erupted as a rollover crash ensued, jarring glass debris and its passengers aboard.

After surviving the collision, the "battered and bloodied" patients were approached by local first responders and a RAAF physician who provided initial triage until higher echelon care was available. **Inter-island medical care**

Once the patients were stabilized, they were transferred onto a US C-130J and flew to Andersen AFB where patients and medical care teams awaited transport to either a UH-72 helicopter, ambulatory bus or Humvee to the U.S. Naval Hospital Guam. A motorcade of emergency response vehicles, accompanied by the ambience of red and blue lights from the Guam Police Department, transported the "accident victims".

The U.S. Navy Medicine Readiness and Training Command (NMRTC) Guam, which recently co-located with navy medicine, was the ideal hospital to accept aeromedical evacuated patients as their final stop, said U.S. Navy Commander Elliot Ross, Senior Medical Officer, NMRTC Guam emergency department.

"This exercise was a great opportunity for the naval hospital on many levels," Ross said. "Drills like these help our team

to hone our skills and with an all hands-on deck approach, we can confidently practice and perform our procedures when responding and managing large-scale medical emergencies."

The hospital's collective efforts included a critical care transport team (CCTT), which conducted inter-facility patient movement at the hospital. They also boarded the Guam Army National Guard's UH-72 helicopter and conducted patient movement from Andersen AFB to NMRTC Guam. An all-hands hospital staff recall was directed for exercise support while the hospital's command center coordinated additional island medical resources, regional military resources and local military operations centers with the NMRTC's new Emergency Management team.

Ross said with the exercises' large muscle movement and potential support to simultaneous real-world incidents, operational challenges were expected, and the hospital staff efficiently overcame those hurdles.

"We rapidly filled the exercise's available bed space and because we were running the hospital in real-time, additional space was limited," Ross added. "We have

the capability to convert single rooms to double rooms, but it is not exercised frequently and is generally reserved for emergency situations. The lack of additional bed space required our staff to execute this plan and double-up our inpatient beds. This was outstanding because we were in real-time executing our emergency plan despite not initially planning to need this."

The MASCAL's design showcased Cope North's interoperable capabilities not only among international military teams, but with local, civilian first responders.

"The exercise's trilateral (construct) was the perfect structure to perform as a unified medical effort in the Marianas region," Johnson added. "Its design enabled all participants to rely on each other's strengths and capabilities to handle the scenario effectively, emphasizing a synergistic response capability."

Whether it's a real-world emergency or a future training scenario, these agencies will be heavily relied on for their expertise. Their ability to find and refine their best practices during Cope North 20 can assure the Indo-Pacific region that the highest echelon of care is available at a moment's notice.

Cope North 2020 joint forces exhibit aerial prowess

Cope North Combined Joint Information Bureau 3/3/2020 - ANDERSEN AIR FORCE BASE, Guam — On a hot flightline with multiple runways that stretch for a combined 22,000 feet long in the heart of the western Pacific, more than 100 aircraft from the U.S. military, Koku Jieitai (Japan Air Self-Defense Force) and the Royal Australian air force took to the Commonwealth of the North Mariana Islands skies.

Exhibiting their military might, the three nations teamed up for the Combat Air Forces large force employment exercise iteration of Cope North 2020 at Andersen Air Force Base and around the CNMI, Palau, and Yap in the Federated States of Micronesia Feb. 12-28.

"This was a historic Cope North exercise," said U.S. Air Force Col. Scott Rowe, Cope North 2020 exercise director. "Instead of individualizing control groups nationally, we performed as a multinational joint task force and integrated the three nations along functional lines."

Scott relished this integration and the chance to operate in an LFE, or large force employment, capacity, which incorporated high volumes of different aircraft and platforms to launch into the airspace at one time for the coordinated exercise.

"Most bases don't have enough assets to perform (large force employment) movements on their own," Rowe said. "Cope North is one of those few chances to bring in an entire (trilateral) package to execute functions such as command and control, close air support, offensive and defensive counterair, and the different individual skill sets the participating units bring."

Engaging in large-scale movements like Cope North is no easy task, especially with the language barriers and different accents. However, this didn't deter an optimistic Rowe, who noticed the steep learning curve everyone inherited as they formed one joint "language" to effectively work together.

"Communication is half the battle and our ability to understand the expectations of each individual functional area was key in knowing how to optimally perform during the exercise," Rowe said. "You never want to experience an unforeseen issue for the first time in a real-world situation. (Therefore), Cope North is important because it gave our participants the environment and opportunity to practice and know-how to execute in a joint environment."

Outlined by the National Defense Strategy, U.S. forces will operate alongside these allied partners to secure the Indo-Pacific region. The chance to deepen training and personal relationships within the Pacific theater is designed to be a force multiplier.

Rowe encouraged the participants to keep in contact, stating that no individual member or service has a monopoly on good ideas and that learning from fellow allied Airmen from each nation ensures that steel sharpens steel.

For the RAAF, the same sentiments were relayed by their leadership as they evaluated how they can refine their best practices.

"One thing the (Royal Australian air force) will take away from Cope North is our interoperability with our Japanese and American allies," said Group Captain Hinton Tayloe, Cope North RAAF executive director, and a three-time Cope North participant. "Our forces are comprised of three things: machine-to-machine, human-to-machine, and human-to-human integration. Practicing our interoperability more closely was a big challenge as we

completely (unified).

With a focus on interoperability, Tayloe emphasized that communication was a strong foundation, but additional steps to fully synchronizing continued to build a solid whole.

"Communication can only take you so far - you have to be on the same page to even take off," Tayloe said. "We had to understand how we fight as individuals to understand how to fight together, and then adapt the way we fight to overcome any hurdles. It took effective synergy to figure out the best way to produce the desired effect and adapt to enhance those effects.

"With effective synergy, the overall outcome allowed us to come together with different capabilities, major systems, languages, dialects and cultures," Tayloe added. "We cleared those hurdles by adapting our (tactics, techniques and procedures) to maximize our effectiveness and result in the best possible outcome."

The pinnacle of these efforts was exhibited during a mass flyover, where an eightship joint coalition formation flew together to signify this alliance. Launching in quick succession, they jointly integrated their fighters and bombers and ascended above expectations as they successfully tested and maximized their combat readiness another year.

Launching approximately 1,200 sorties, the multinational, combined air power was able to posture, operate and project combat air dominance – reestablishing that the Indo-Pacific is in safe, stable and secure hands.

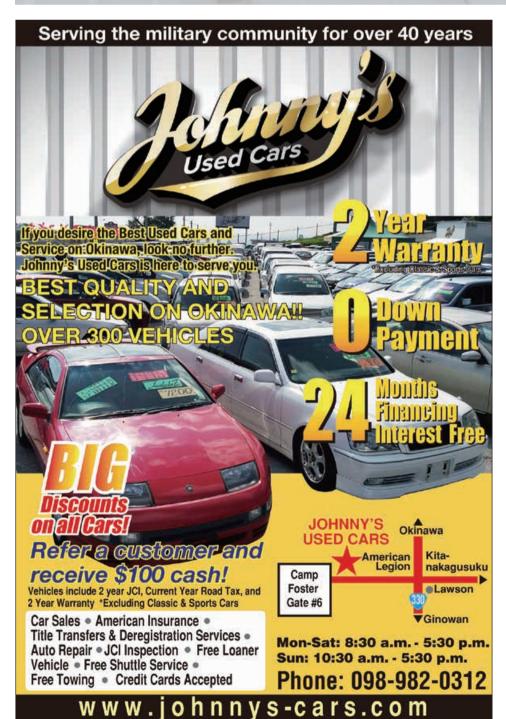

In order to best support personnel with pets transferring from Okinawa, Kadena, TMO Passenger Travel requests port call submissions to be made as soon as possible once the assignment is known for all Air Force personnel PCSing within peak season (01 May-30 Sep 20). Please note, the Patriot Express is very limited on pet spaces and its first come, first served. PCS orders are not required for reservations. Only two pets max per family for Patriot Express; to include mil-to-mil families. Maximum combined pet & kennel weight is 150 lbs for Patriot Express and 99 lbs for commercial airlines (subject to airline policy). Pets are defined as cats or dogs only. Have you received a referral from your Primary Care Manager (PCM) and wondering what you should do next?

Please stop by the Referral Management Center (RMC) to update all of your contact information and provide any required additional referral information. Once RMC receives your referral from the PCM, they will process it to either the Naval Hospital on Camp Foster or to TRICARE ISOS, for off-base specialty care. If your referral is with the Naval Hospital, please allow them 3 business days to contact you to book your appointment. If your referral is for off-base specialty care it is processed to TRICARE ISOS, who has the ultimate responsibility to source a Host Nation

facility and book the appointment. The length of time to receive an appointment date varies on the clinic specialty; this wait time may fluctuate between 2-8 weeks. ISOS will communicate with beneficiaries via email. If you have any questions regarding referrals, please contact the RMC at 630-4817.

How to File a Complaint with IG

If you believe you are unable to resolve your complaint through supervisory channels, you may seek IG assistance to determine if the complaint should be filed with the IG. You can file a complaint if you reasonably believe inappropriate conduct has occurred or a violation of law, policy, procedures, or regulation has been committed. Complete the personnel data information on an AF Form 102 and briefly outline the facts and relevant information related to the issue or complaint. List the allegations of wrongdoing briefly, in general terms and provide supporting narrative detail and documents later, when interviewed by an IG person. Allegations should be written as bullets and should answer who committed the violation; what violation was committed; what law, regulation, procedures, or policy was violated; when did the violation occur. 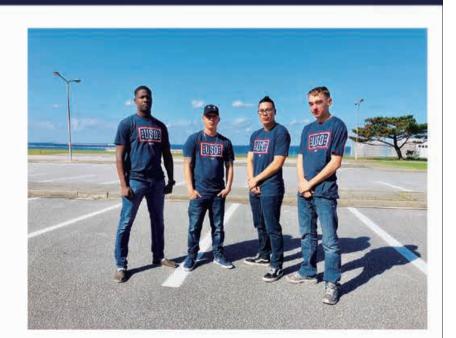

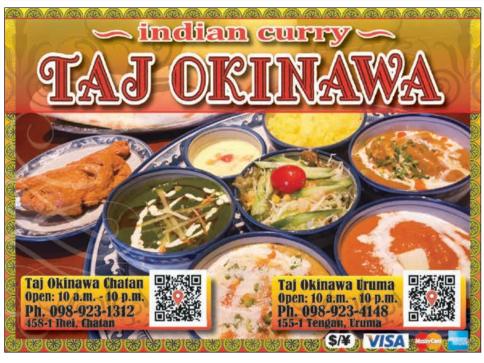

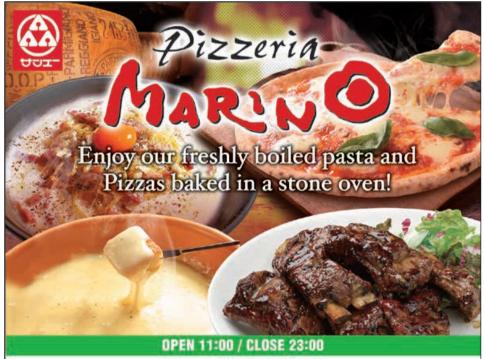
