USAF, JASDF strengthen Agile Combat Employment capabilities

Fifth Air Force 8/30/2020 - CHITOSE AIR BASE, Japan — U.S. Air Force and the Japan Air Self-Defense Force Airmen conducted bilateral training centered on honing defensive counter-air and Agile Combat Employment capabilities and developing Multi-Capable Airmen during an Aviation Training Relocation event at Chitose Air Base, Japan, Aug. 24 through 28.

Led by Fifth Air Force, the training incorporated Airmen and aircraft from the U.S. Air Force, Pacific Air Forces Command's 35th Fighter Wing, 374th Airlift Wing and 18th Wing, alongside the Japan Air Self-Defense Force Air Defense Command's 2nd Air Wing and the Air Support Command's 1st Tactical Airlift Group, 2nd Tactical Airlift Group, and

3rd Tactical Airlift Group.

Overall, U.S. Air Force participants included approximately 200 personnel with six F-15 Eagles from the 67th Fighter Squadron and six F-16 Fighting Falcons from the 13th Fighter Squadron that relocated to Chitose.

"This Chitose Aviation Training Relocation provided a tremendous opportunity for the 67th Fighter Squadron's operations, maintenance and support personnel to practice and perfect Agile Combat Employment capabilities with our U.S. Forces Japan and Koku-Jieitai partners," said Lt Col. Craig Van Beusekom, 67th Fighter Squadron commander. "Here at Chitose, we demonstrated deployable, secure communications and empowered bilateral personnel to refuel a U.S. Air Force F-15, F-16, and Koku-Jieitai F-15J Eagle aircraft with airlift-deployable fuel bladders."

Putting Airmen in scenarios outside their regular daily duties is central to the ACE concept, which calls for Airmen to be proficient in many skills necessary to support air operations. Creating a force of "multi-capable Airmen" reduces the personnel footprint required to disperse forces, enabling a faster, more efficient response to any potential threats.

"The MCA concept was implemented by utilizing multiple career fields and merging them into performing each other's duties," said Master Sgt. Stephen Morin, 13th Aircraft Maintenance Unit's production superintendent. "For instance, we had specialists, such as avionics, learning how to launch [aircraft] and then performing those actions, enabling us to free up other specialties to continue working on arising situations."

In addition, training accomplished on-site tested U.S. Air Force and Japan Air Self-Defense Force partners' ability to work together and teach each other new skill sets with members performing bilateral security, maintenance and refueling operations.

Prioritizing the training while managing a cautious approach with regard to COVID-19 for

participants' safety proved valuable based on the accomplishments for both U.S. Air Force and Koku-Jieitai members.

"Continuing to train alongside our Japanese allies despite the challenges presented by COVID-19 is absolutely necessary to maintain strong bilateral interoperability and readiness to support the defense of Japan," said Col. Brandon McBrayer, Director of Operations and Plans

for Fifth Air Force and the principal officer in charge of training operations during the Chitose Aviation Training Relocation.

"Airmen observed strict preventative measures to mitigate the risk of COVID-19 infection and were able to take full advantage of the opportunity to strengthen bilateral ACE capabilities, further ensuring our ability to maintain peace and security in the Indo-Pacific."

Air Force seeks dress and appearance ideas through new crowdsourcing campaign

9/3/2020 - WASHINGTON — The Department of the Air Force launched a new crowdsourcing campaign to solicit ideas for dress and appearance improvements on the Air Force Ideation Platform, IdeaScale.

Airmen and civilians are invited to submit ideas beginning Sept. 3.

"If we want an environment in which Airmen feel valued, we need to create transformative opportunities to foster a culture of innovation and then listen to their ideas," said Lisa Truesdale, Air Force military force policy deputy director. "Additionally, wearing the uniform and having pride in your personal appearance enhances esprit de corps."

Dress and personal-appearance ideas submitted to IdeaScale may be presented to the Air Force Uniform Board after review by Air Force personnel subject matter experts. The uniform board will make recommendations to the Air Force chief of staff. All CSAF-approved ideas will be implemented within AFI 36-2903, Dress and Personal Appearance of Air Force Personnel. If an idea does not meet the Air Force Uniform Board, a notice with rationale will be sent to the submitter.

"We want our dress and appearance guidance to be inclusive," Truesdale said. "We are committed to considering the views of all members. Individuals contribute their highest levels of creativity when they are cared for and feel a sense of belonging."

The following categories are available for idea sub-

mission:

GROOMING AND APPEARANCE STANDARDS (e.g. hairstyles, beards, shaving, etc.)

DRESS UNIFORMS (Service Dress, Mess Dress & accessories (e.g. hat, shoes, shirt, belt, tie, ribbons, medals, insignia, etc.))

UTILITY UNIFORM (Operational Camouflage Pattern Uniform & associated accessories (e.g. hat, boots, belt, T-shirt, insignia, etc.))

ACCESSORIES (e.g. jewelry, earrings, rings, purses, backpacks, gym bags, phone, headphones, etc.)

OUTER GARMENTS (e.g. pullover sweater, cardigan sweater, lightweight blue jacket, fleece, etc.)

PHYSICAL TRAINING GEAR (e.g. shorts, pants, jacket, shoes, socks, shirt, etc.)

FLIGHT DUTY UNIFORMS (Two-Piece Flight Duty Uniform, Flight Duty Uniform, Desert Flight Duty Uniform & associated accessories (e.g. hat, boots, T-shirt, patches, insignia, etc.))

BADGES AND SPECIALTY INSIGNIA (e.g. organization badges, unit patches, duty identification patches, tabs, etc.)

MATERNITY UNIFORMS (e.g. Service Dress, Utility, accessories, etc.)

B-2s, B-1s join USMC, Australian Defence Forces in combined exercise

 9/3/2020 - NAVAL SUPPORT FACILITY, Diego Garcia — B-2 Spirits and B-1 Lancers participated in a combined United States-Australia exercise in Australia's Northern Territory by providing long-distance air strikes as part of a combined task force with the Marine Rotational Force-Darwin and Australian Defence Forces (ADF) in August.

B-2s of the 393rd Expeditionary Bomb Squadron (EBS), deployed from Whiteman Air Force Base, Missouri, to Naval Support Facility, Diego Garcia, flew roughly 3,991 miles, or 6,424 km, during multiple sorties to operate over Delamere, Bradshaw and Mount Bundy training areas in Australia. Additionally, a squadron of KC-135s from the 909th Air

Refueling Squadron at Kadena Air Base, Japan flew to Darwin, Australia to support the bomber presence.

The exercise focused on a small naval expeditionary force's ability to rapidly deploy, integrate with allies, coordinate airstrikes and call for close air support on targets within a contested environments.

During this combined exercise, MRF-D and ADF joint terminal air controllers (JTACs) coordinated airstrikes with U.S. Air Force B-1B Lancers deployed to Andersen Air Force Base, Guam, and the B-2s before passing those same aircraft to tactical units to conducting dynamic targeting, which is striking unplanned and unanticipated targets.

"It's imperative that the U.S. Marine Corps and Australian Army work together," said Australian Army Sgt. Aaron Costes, a JTAC with 102nd Coral Battery.

"It's such a feat that we can infill and have an aircraft come in from such long distances."

The 393rd EBS bombers provided air-to-ground low pass coverage while U.S. Marines used both traditional and modern forms of target location and confirmation to call for coordinated, rapid-air strikes, including live munitions dropped on targets in a demonstration of the B-2 Spirit's precision strike capabilities.

The B-2's low-observable, or stealth, characteristics gives the bomber the ability to penetrate an enemy's defenses and threaten heavily defended targets. The B-1B is capable of tracking, targeting and engaging moving vehicles, and the fully integrated data link with Link-16 capability provides improved battlefield situation awareness and security beyond line of sight reach back connectivity.

Nothing'll stop the U.S. Air Force

Both nations' JTACs also worked alongside Australian Tiger Armed Reconnaissance Helicopters and U.S. Marine Corps RQ-21A Blackjacks to identify and surveil simulated targets.

"Airman and Marines integrate seamlessly together because we speak the same language," said U.S. Air Force Lt. Col. Christopher Conant, Bomber Task Force commander. "We both understand how to maneuver cognitively and physically to achieve an objective."

The training comes on the heels of the 2020 Australia-U.S. Ministerial Consultations in Washington, D.C., between U.S. Secretary of State Mike Pompeo, U.S. Secretary of Defense Mark Esper, Australian Minister for Foreign Affairs Marise Payne and Australian Minister for Defence Linda Reynolds July 28. During the meeting, both governments'

officials reaffirmed both countries commitment to a stable, secure and prosperous Pacific.

The 393rd EBS was deployed to Diego Garcia Aug. 11, and also conducted missions into the Bay of Bengal. The 37th EBS was deployed to Guam July 17 where it conducted missions in the East China Sea, South China Sea, and with Japanese Air Self-Defense Force and the U.S. Navy and U.S. Marine Corps.

Both aircrafts deployed to the Indo-Pacific region in recent months as part of the United States' commitment to a free and open Indo-Pacific for both the United States and our allies. The successful deployment and execution of these missions demonstrate the bombers of Air Force Global Strike Command's abilities to deliver lethal, long-range, strike options anytime, anywhere to our allies in the Indo-Pacific region.

8/28/2020 - YOKOTA AIR BASE — Airmen assigned to the 459th Airlift Squadron, 374th Security Forces Squadron and 18th Aeromedical Evacuation Squadron, worked together with Soldiers assigned to the Public Health Activity-Japan, Veterinary Treatment Facility, to participate in a C-12J, K-9 air evacuation training, Aug. 20.

The training focused on K-9 evacuation procedures on a 459th AS C-12J Huron and provided 374th SFS military working dog handlers and AE crews with hands-on medical response scenarios focusing on patient parameters, en route requirements and basic care and treatment of

common military working dog injuries.

By further developing this capability, the Airmen and Soldiers are able to respond more efficiently as they transport MWDs to better-equipped facilities within the area of responsibility.

“Ensuring the MWD are fit to fight is as high a priority as the Soldiers, Sailors, Marines and Airmen they support,” said Capt. Nicholas Strobel, 459th AS C-12J instructor pilot. “This means that if one is injured or requires higher medical care than is available at their current location, the 18th AES will ensure they are transported safely and comfortably to those facilities.”

“This capability remains a rare but important task for the canine and veterinary support team,”

said U.S. Army Capt. James Gaffney, PHA-J, VTF OIC. “Smaller Veterinary Treatment Facilities are not set up with personnel and equipment for prolonged or complicated medical cases. Conducting an exercise to rehearse the steps and develop a common operational picture between the human and veterinary medical teams is important to streamline future movement of animals”

Understanding these operational barriers, what equipment is available on-board the aircraft, what challenges they can potentially face and how to best respond when moving these animals was a key objective in this exercise.

“The physical exercise of transporting the military working dog for a real-world flight helped us understand the configuration of the aircraft and modalities available to us and what veterinary-specific equipment we will have to supply,” added Gaffney.

Having the right equipment and preparation ensures the teams are better prepared for any potential real-world aeromedical evacuations in the AOR.

“While Team Yokota has been lucky to not require this type of event in the past, we know we are better prepared for the future and can share our lessons learned with other MWD kennels and PHA-J VTFs as well,” said Gaffney.

Complete the personnel data information on an AF Form 102 and briefly outline the facts and relevant information related to the issue or complaint. List the allegations of wrongdoing briefly, in general terms and provide supporting narrative detail and documents later, when interviewed by an IG person. Allegations should be written as bullets and should answer who committed the violation; what violation was committed; what law, regulation, procedures, or policy was violated; when did the violation occur.
